About the course

The PsychD in Child and Adolescent Psychotherapy (the Independent Training) is a four-year full-time, highly selective professional doctorate. The course aims to develop the academic, clinical and research skills needed to practice as a professional Child and Adolescent Psychotherapist. Completion of the doctorate leads to professional membership of the Association of Child Psychotherapists (ACP). Teaching is offered in a small group setting and aims to provide a thorough understanding of child development, childhood psychopathology and psychotherapeutic techniques linked with direct experience of clinical work and conducting relevant research.

Purpose of the post

The Research Tutor post offers an opportunity for someone to join a small team of experienced academic supervisors and work collaboratively in teaching, supervising and supporting students in completing their PsychD research theses. This will entail some combination of providing small-group seminar teaching, and assisting individual students in the process of devising, conducting, analysing and writing-up their research projects, which are mostly worked on across years two and three of the course.

The post-holder will be home-based during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic; thereafter at the Anna Freud Centre, 4-8 Rodney Street, London N1 9JH. The course takes a blended learning approach to teaching, and it is anticipated that some teaching and supervision in 2021/22 will be provided remotely (online) and some will be provided through face-to-face contact with students.
