Therapist Responsiveness: Challenges and Opportunities



Therapists' decisions and actions are affected by, among many other things, client expressions and behaviors. Adaptations of the therapeutic process in response to client expression and behavior can be summarized under the term "therapist responsiveness". Such therapist responsiveness may operate within the therapeutic relationship, as adaptation of a specific therapeutic technique or as an explicit orientation towards client characteristics. Therapist responsiveness may represent challenges in psychotherapy research, when studying clinical outcome and mechanisms of change. However, therapist responsiveness may also offer opportunities for developing new assessments and designs for the future of psychotherapy research.

For the 9th Meeting of the European Chapter of the Society for Psychotherapy Research (EU-SPR), we selected the topic of "Therapist Responsiveness: Challenges and Opportunities". Since Gordon Paul's plea, in 1957, on what perspectives need to be considered in psychotherapy outcome research – speaking to an almost unbearable complexity – psychotherapy researchers have worked to develop methods to take into account the individual patient in research. However, while important advances for the field, many of these methods have not taken into account the fact that the one who is supposed to deliver a specific therapy (the therapist) is affected by the one who comes in to be treated (the patient). To use a shortcut, the independent variable depends on the dependent variable, which becomes a fundamental problem in the design.

The European Chapter of SPR thinks it is time to discuss these problems in-depth and to take a step forward in understanding therapist responsiveness, for example its relationship with other variables of the therapeutic relationship, such as the therapeutic alliance, and to contribute to ignite more related research across therapy approaches. Such a step may just be one on a journey which aims at building a knowledge base which could have an impact on understanding and doing psychotherapy differently than today. The Rome 2022 Chapter Meeting may contribute to this process in various ways.

The planning of the 9th EU-SPR meeting in Rome was embedded in the particularly challenging context of the pandemic. European citizens, and worldwide, still recall today Rome's suffering at the time of the first wave hitting Europe coming from the south. Therefore, in this dramatic context, the organization of the Rome 2022 meeting became like a flag a number of SPR members persistently and proudly continued to hold up with us during these, at times dark, months. Definitely, the Rome 2022 EU-SPR Meeting is the fruit of exceptional commitment to SPR and its members. We thank the Rome 2022 Planning Committee and all our colleagues from the Italy Area Group of SPR for their hard work, lightheartedness and friendship. Heartfelt thanks also to the colleagues from the Scientific Committee for their very helpful advice and their efficient turn-around when it came to rate the submissions. Finally, we acknowledge all volunteers, colleagues from support at SPR and the Executive Councils of EU-SPR and of SPR for their support of the Rome 2022 conference.

And now, enjoy and get inspired by the scientific program of Rome 2022, enjoy the meeting against the backdrop of an unforgettable scene steeped in history!




