

Assistant or Associate Professor of Social Work Couple and Family Therapy

The School of Social Work of McGill University invites applications for a full-time tenure-track position, beginning January 2015. The ideal candidate will demonstrate a passion and talent in excellent clinical practice and will have established a promising program of research and scholarship in the field of couple and family therapy. S/he will hold a doctorate in social work or a related discipline and have experience in teaching and clinical supervision. Strong consideration will be given to qualified applicants who have expertise in working with children and families across the lifecycle, are bilingual (French and English), eligible for certification as a psychotherapist and couple and family therapist in the province of Quebec, and have experience working with diverse populations.

The successful candidate will have the exciting opportunity to contribute to the development, teaching and success of the first Masters program in couple and family therapy to be offered by a Canadian university in social work. The program curriculum is guided by the clinical requirements established by the Ordre des travailleurs sociaux et des thérapeutes conjugaux et familiaux du Québec (OTSTCFQ); American Association of Marriage and Family Therapy (AAMFT) and the training in psychotherapy as outlined in the Psychotherapy Regulations of Law 21. The program will enrol its first cohort of students in Fall 2014. Graduates will be eligible for two professional permits: Couple and family therapist (OTSTCFQ) and Psychotherapist (OPQ).

The program is recruiting students from a variety of disciplines including social work, counselling and clinical psychology, nursing, and medicine.

This important appointment forms part of the academic renewal of the School of Social Work, which includes the development of this new Masters in Couple and Family Therapy, an expanded doctoral program, as well as 9 new tenure-track faculty appointments, a new generalist BSW curriculum, and an MSW offering 3 specialist streams (children & families, health & social care, and international & community development).
