Preface

Dear Colleagues,

The Conference Program Planning Committee and Local Organizing Committee are honored to extend a warm and cordial welcome to all attendees of the 54th International Annual Meeting of the Society for Psychotherapy Research (SPR). Whether joining us in Dublin in-person or online, we hope you enjoy a productive and engaging meeting experience.

Dublin, the capital of Ireland, is known for its vibrant cultural life, historic landmarks, famous beer, traditional music, and literary heritage. Located on the east coast of Ireland, the city offers a unique blend of urban sophistication and natural beauty, with parks, scenic coastal walks, and nearby mountains to explore.

This year the central theme of our meeting is "Reshaping the social representation of psychotherapy: An engagement with public mental health." Perhaps the clearest evidence of the relevance of the chosen theme is the number of papers submitted for this meeting, which shows the engagement of the members of our scientific society. Each and every type of presentation, whether posters, brief papers, panels, structured discussions, has had an all-time record number of submissions. The amount and variety of papers received meant a great challenge for the design of this scientific program, but also allowed us to see directly the growth of our scientific society. The complexity of mental health interventions is clearly represented by the wealth of research devices that will be presented throughout the meeting.

On behalf of the Conference Program Planning Committee, we would like to thank you all for the submission of Panels, Brief Papers, Structured Discussions, Posters, and Pre-Conference Workshops.

In light of the ongoing global situation and a growing concern for the environment, last year we experienced the first-ever hybrid SPR meeting, which allowed us to accommodate presenters from different time zones around the world while also reducing our carbon footprint. Due to the continued need for flexibility and our commitment to sustainability, this year's conference will also be held in a hybrid format. Our aim has been to create a program that maintains the high standards of academic excellence and inclusivity that are defining characteristics of the SPR, while also taking into account the impact of our actions on the planet. We have worked hard to ensure that all accepted submissions are given equal consideration, regardless of whether they are presented in person or online. We hope that this hybrid approach

will not only help to further enhance the inclusiveness and accessibility of the event but also contribute to a more sustainable future.

All livestreamed sessions will be available to our global audience through the interactive online event platform, myOnvent. Sessions will also be recorded and available for viewing later. All times are given in the Dublin time zone. Time zone of Dublin during daylight saving time is Western European Summer Time (WEST), which has a UTC offset of +1 hour.

On Thursday, June 22nd, we have online sessions at 17:00 and 18:00, to ensure that international online participants can present at a time that is appropriate in their time zone.

Venue: The conference will take place at the historic Trinity College Dublin, located in the heart of the city. Founded in 1592, Trinity College is the oldest university in Ireland, with a rich history of academic excellence and innovation. The campus features stunning architecture, beautiful gardens, and state-of-the-art facilities for teaching and research. Trinity College is committed to accessibility and inclusivity, and offers a range of facilities for people with mobility issues, such as wheelchair ramps and elevators.

Program Structure: The program starts on Wednesday, June 21st, with a total of 15 Pre-Conference workshops: 8 on site and 7 virtual. The Opening Ceremony begins on Wednesday evening at 17.00 and includes the Presidential Address and Awards Ceremony with a wine and food reception to follow.

Coffee will be available throughout the conference beginning Thursday with scheduled coffee/tea breaks in the mid-morning and mid-afternoon for Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

Chapter meetings are scheduled for Thursday, June 22nd, during the lunch hour. Lunch will be offered in two seatings and because of the volume of participants will also have to be provided on the concourses of the conference venue in addition to the East Dining Hall, which limits the choice of available food (for which we seek your understanding). Blue and green colored badge attendees will have lunch from 12.00 to 13.00, followed by their chapter meetings from 13.00-14.00. Yellow and Pink coloured badges will have their chapter meetings first from 12.00 to 13.00, followed by lunch from 13.00-14.00.

The General Membership Meeting –open to all– is scheduled for Friday, June 23rd from 14.00 to 15.30.

Sections, Special Interest Groups and former editors' meetings will be held on Saturday, June 24th, during the scheduled lunch from 12.30 to 14.00. A box lunch will be provided.

Panels, Brief Paper Sessions, Semi-Plenaries, and Structured Discussions will take place 08:30–19:00 on Thursday and Friday, and 08:30–16:30 on Saturday. As usual, we will have poster sessions on Thursday and Friday evenings (19.00 to 20.00). You can also explore all posters online in our virtual poster hall in myOnvent throughout the conference. Following the poster session Friday evening, student and post-doc members have organized a Student's Night, where students can meet and enjoy time together.

On Friday we will have six high-profile semi-plenaries, which reflect the theme of the conference excellently and which you do not want to miss.

This year the sessions on Saturday are very full and important in terms of the number of panels that are presented. We will enjoy and continue our discussions on Saturday until sessions end at 16:30.

The conference banquet will be held at 19.00 Saturday evening, June 24th, at the Round Room at The Mansion House in the Dublin City Centre, which is a historic venue that has played host to numerous important events over the years. 
