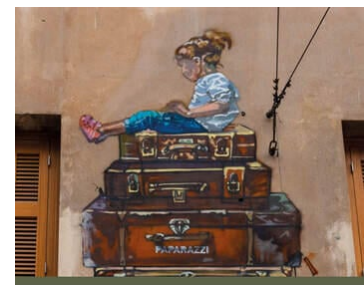
"To be a child psychotherapist you need a lot of different skills, in work with parents, carrying out assessments, liaising with the network and transference issues"
