

The Counseling Psychologist (TCP) is announcing a call for proposals for manuscripts exploring the professional training and personal well-being of international students in U.S. counseling psychology programs.

Conceptual and empirical examinations of various constructs, processes, and theories relevant to the professional and personal development of international students enrolled in counseling psychology programs in the U.S. are invited for this issue. Such examinations can be conducted at the student level and/or trainer/supervisor/advisor level in relation to international students. Topics may include but are not limited to:

- 1. Research training
- 2. Clinical training
- 3. Advocacy training
- 4. Career development
- 5. Acculturation/enculturation
- 6. Well-being

#### Proposals will be evaluated based on:

- 1. Relevance of the topic to international students in U.S. counseling psychology training programs
- 2. The adequacy of the article topic(s) to the special issue
- 3. The critical analysis of the topic(s)
- 4. Implications for training, well-being, interventions, and future research with international students
- 5. Viability of the project and likelihood of completion of manuscript by March 15, 2020 deadline

# Proposals should be no more than 6 pages (double spaced, including references) and include:

- 1. Rationale for and aims of the proposed manuscript
- 2. Summary of relevant guiding theory/framework
- 3. Summary of the constructs that will be explored
- 4. Relevant background information (e.g., cultural, historical, linguistic, and/or legal factors) of international students in Counseling Psychology
- 5. Implications of the paper for international students in Counseling Psychology in relation to training, research, practice, career development, and/or well-being.

Please note: Proposals longer than 6 pages (double-spaced) will not be considered.

All full manuscripts will go through standard peer review and revisions may be required. We cannot guarantee acceptance. Due to the volume of proposals submitted, specific feedback on proposals will not be provided.

- July 30, 2019: Deadline for proposals
- September 30, 2019: Decisions on proposals sent to authors
- March 15, 2020: Full paper submission deadline
