

This workshop will survey recent work on the social determinants of mental health and discuss issues in the design and implementation of culturallymixed-methods appropriate research with Indigenous communities and populations. The emphasis will be on conceptual issues and the development of research methodology to address both common and severe mental health problems and interventions. Specific topics will include: indigenous concepts of well-being; developmental perspectives on identity and resilience; communityparticipatory research; empowerment evaluation; substance use research methods; truth and reconciliation in mental health; land and place in healing; scaling up mental health promotion programs; culturally based interventions.
