This MSc is designed to advance the careers of aspiring professionals in medicine, mental health, psychology, psychiatry, and other fields where mental health is the focus of the work. We do this by sharing the scientific evidence base to inform professional practice and empower research that will change the way care is provided.

The MSc in Mental Health programme consists of three modules:

Advanced skills in mental health, Psychological therapies or Cultural and global perspectives in mental health care (depending on the pathway chosen), and Mental health research.

Students also complete a clinical/work placement and a dissertation.

We offer a variety of modes of study including distance learning, part-time, PGCert and PGDip options.

Why study for an MSc in Mental Health at Queen Mary?
