"Screening and Interviewing with Refugees: Understanding Trauma and the Mental Health Needs"

This webinar is the first of a series of free skills building webinars focused on providing trauma informed mental health services to address the needs of the growing number refugees, immigrants, and internally displaced people worldwide. Information about participating and being listed in the Refugee Mental Health Resource Network, an APA Division 56 interdivisional pro-bono project will be presented. Strategies for working with refugees and agencies will be discussed including a framework for understanding the mental health and trauma needs associated with each stage of the refugee experience. Interventions ranging from community to individual for gender-based violence, mental health challenges, and victims of torture will be described. This webinar will provide a helpful foundation for the March 17, 2017 webinar on conducting asylum evaluations.



Elizabeth Carll, PhD is president of the APA Trauma Psychology Division and chairs the interdivisional

Refugee Mental Health Resource Network. Dr. Carll serves on the executive committee and is a former chair of the United Nations NGO Committee on Mental Health and has developed a variety of disaster/crisis management programs.



Carl Auerbach, PhD is professor of psychology at the Ferkauf Graduate School of Yeshiva University. He co-

directs, with Dr. William Salton, the Yeshiva Asylum Project, that trains graduate students to work with asylum seekers. He was a Fulbright Fellow teaching and conducting research at the Rwandan National University.
